

Autism Service Dogs

In Canada 1 in 100 children is diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder. At Dogs with Wings, we provide Autism Service Dogs that are specifically trained to anchor a child. By relying on a tether to the dog's harness, the child is prevented from bolting into a dangerous situation. The calming effect that an **Autism Service Dog** provides can reduce a child's anxiety and emotional outbursts, helping when the child is transitioning to a new place or situation. Over time, a Dogs with Wings partner can provide the potential for greater social interaction for the child, reduced stress in the home, improving quality of life for the whole family.

Guide Dogs

Those with visual impairment need to be safe in their communities. They must be able to cross busy streets with traffic, or deal with uneven pavement and curbs, which can all be challenges. Dogs with Wings provides highly-trained **Guide Dogs** that can open up a whole new world of safety, security and independence, helping the visually impaired to work, go to school and be an active member of their community.



Companion and Facility Dogs

Dogs with Wings also offers **Companion and Facility Dogs** for those who would benefit from having a dog, but do not require public access. These dogs can be used in a variety of therapeutic settings like schools, hospitals and treatment programs of various kinds.
